

Syllabus: World History

Teacher: Ms. Monk

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Course Description and Purpose: This class will trace the story of God's plan for mankind from the beginning in the Garden of Eden through the ancient kingdoms of Assyria, Babylon, Persia, Greece and Rome into the Middle Ages. The story continues with the Protestant Reformation and finishes with the birth of the United States and the Modern Age. Students will be encouraged and challenged to view history not just as facts to read and memorize but an account of God's redeeming and restoring love. Students will gain an understanding of not only world events but also the patterns behind these events that will enable them to make wise choices. Classroom skills of reading comprehension, note taking, map work, class discussion, and evaluation by quizzes and tests will continue to be developed.

Assignments: Students are required to listen, read, take notes, keep an organized notebook and be engaged in the learning process. Work not completed in class will become homework. There will be a variety of class and homework assignments, which will include map projects, and writing assignments.

- Classwork and homework will be posted on the right side of the board in the last square which is marked with a M.
- Quizzes, projects, and tests will be posted on the left side of the board in the last square which is marked with an M.

It is the student's responsibility to write down assignments in their planners. If they are absent they are to write down the missed work that will be in a binder on the back shelf.

Evaluation: There will be quizzes on the chapters (or sections of the chapter) and a test at the end of the unit. During the unit study there will be map projects, art journal projects, section and chapter review questions. There will be a semester exam at the end of each semester.

Grading: Daily 25%, Quizzes 25%, Tests/Major Projects 50%
